The Honorary Fellow Award bestows an honorary membership to individuals who have contributed significantly to the field of ultrasound.



Carlo Martinoli, MD

A specialist in diagnostic radiology, Carlo Martinoli, MD, received his medical degree in 1986 from the University of Genoa, which still remains his home institution. Before receiving his national qualification as a professor of radiology, he held positions as staff radiologist, assistant professor of radiology, and associate professor of radiology. Professor Martinoli's emphasis on ultrasound and imaging of the musculoskeletal and peripheral nervous systems is known globally, and he has received many well-deserved teaching and professional awards

from multiple scientific associations in Europe and the United States, including the American Roentgen Ray Society, Radiological Society of North America, European Society for Paediatric Research, European Society of Urogenital Radiology and Society of Uroradiology, and European Congress of Radiology.

Professor Martinoli has published more than 200 scientific articles in peer-reviewed medical journals around the world. Committed to high-quality musculoskeletal radiology education, he is also coauthor of 2 highly popular textbooks: *Ultrasound of the Musculoskeletal System* (written in English but subsequently translated into Korean, Turkish, Polish, and Chinese) and *A Radiologically-Guided Approach to Musculoskeletal Anatomy*.

A renowned speaker, Professor Martinoli has given more than 800 lectures worldwide, been invited by 28 universities to present seminars, symposia, or visiting-professor lectures, and held 6 honorary lectures at scientific events abroad.

An active member of the European Society of Musculoskeletal Radiology (ESSR), Professor Martinoli has served that professional association as a member of its Executive Committee, as chairman for ultrasound, as chairman of the Educational Committee, and as chairman of the ESSR Annual Congress in Genoa, Italy, in 2009. A founder of the International Society of Peripheral Neurophysiological Imaging, which aims to forward global education and research in peripheral nerve imaging, he has also served as member-at-large of the Executive Committee of the International Skeletal Society. The American Institute of Ultrasound in Medicine looks forward to this same level of association commitment as it proudly names Professor Martinoli, an outstanding educator and physician, an honorary fellow.
